Children's Mental Health Data

- Pre-pandemic: 1 in 4 children experienced mental health issue
 - Source: KIDS COUNT Data Center
- During pandemic: 9% increase in youth 11-17 using MHA online screening tool.

Childhood Trauma

ADVERSE CHILDHOOD EXPERIENCES (ACEs)



Separation from a parent including death or incarceration



Living with or experiencing domestic violence, parental substance abuse or mental illness, or community violence



Physical or emotional abuse or neglect



Economic hardship

of children in Virginia have experienced two or more ACEs









The stressful impact or emotional pain of one's experience with racism and discrimination



RACIAL TRAUMA & HISTORICAL TRAUMA

Cumulative emotional and psychological harm, as a result of group traumatic experiences, transmitted across generations within communities and families



Support Parents

- Economic and financial supports
- Home visitors and parent coaches
- Paid leave to care for family

1 in 5 parents reports feeling depressed or hopeless during the pandemic.

Start Early



In Virginia, over half of all children with public health insurance who are diagnosed with a mental health condition are under the age of 12

- Train early educators to identify and respond to socialemotional needs
- Build response systems such as ECMHC to help educators, parents & kids






Leverage Medicaid


- Increase incentives and opportunities to bill screening
- Incentivize care coordination
- "Free care rule" to apply to school based services

1 in 3 kids are enrolled in Medicaid/FAMIS

- Ensure widespread training for mental health professionals to meet the needs of children of color & to respond to racial & historical trauma
- Incentivize a diverse workforce to serve children




