Six things this relationship is built on

TIME	A long relationship lets both partners build trust and adapt as workforce needs change.
PEOPLE	Dedicated recruiters and industry professionals engage directly with our students and staff.
EXPERTISE	Industry input keeps curriculum, equipment, and credentials aligned to modern shipbuilding and advanced manufacturing.
ADVOCACY	NNS/HII elevates the value of CTE and the training capacity our region and nation require.
INVESTMENT	Financial and in-kind support sustains facilities, equipment, and student experiences.
OPPORTUNITY	Exploration, interviews, employment, and apprenticeship while students are still in high school.

CHANGING THE PERCEPTION

Today's CTE is advanced technical education

Students develop sophisticated technical skills, earn industry-recognized credentials, and prepare for careers offering strong wages, continued education, and economic independence.

A student choosing advanced technical training leading to a high-wage, high-demand career has not chosen less. That student has chosen a different pathway to success.

A QUESTION FOR VIRGINIA

How do we create more pathways like this?

- Sustained regional CTE capacity that crosses division boundaries
- Employers engaged long before the point of hire
- Dedicated people on both sides connecting students and industry
- Industry voice in curriculum, equipment, and credentials
- Direct transitions into employment, apprenticeship, and continued education
- Career navigation that begins well before senior year
- Outcome reporting that separates employment from the bundled placement measure and looks beyond the second quarter after exit

The goal isn't simply to get young people through school. It's to help them see where school can take them.
